
Various inter and intra house activities are held in school like poetry writing, debates, Quiz, Storytelling, Whizkid etc to develop and nurture the hidden talents.

SCHOOL RULES

- 1. All the students must maintain and carry the School Almanac every day.
- 2. Students of all classes must come to school in flawless school uniform with school ID card. Short skirts above the knee are not permitted. Girls must make two braids and nails should be trimmed. No nail paint and henna is allowed.
- 3. Boys must be in conventional hair cut. No trendy hair cut is allowed,
- 4. Students must maintain punctuality and discipline. The school gate will be closed after the first bell rings in the morning. Late comers will have to go back home unless the parents personally explain the reason for delay.
- 5. Students who come to school accompanied by an escort are not to leave before the escort arrives. The students up to Class II will be handed over to the escort only after showing the gate pass issued by the school. For others, escort must have due authority in writing from the parents. In case of delay, Parents should inform at the school reception.
- 6. Parents are requested to carry I-Card issued by School Authorities while visiting school and adhere to the token system during PTMs.
- 7. Parents of NUR to UKG students must write their ward's name on their belongings with a permanent marker.
- 8. Parents and guardians are not allowed to visit their wards or teachers in the class rooms during school hours.
- 9. A child who has been suffering from any contagious disease / Covid-19, will be allowed to attend classes only after producing the medical fitness certificate showing that he / she is free from infection.
- 10. Students are not allowed to go home once they come to school in the morning. Parents must NOT send their wards to school if they are unwell or have any outside appointment during school hours. This is mostly seen on Cycle Test / Periodic Test / Unit Test days. If a child leaves after cycle test / periodic test, he / she will be marked absent for the day.
- 11. Students who wish to celebrate their birthday can do so by distributing toffies and candies only. Elaborate birthday celebrations are not permitted. Casuals are allowed to be worn on the day of birthday only upto class V.
- 12. Students are not allowed to roam in the corridors or around the school surroundings. Truancy from the class will entail punishment. No student will leave his/her class without the permission of the teacher concerned. Class pass must be carried by students if going out of the class.
- 13. Students are not allowed to use the school telephone without the permission of the Heads of the school.
- 14. Students are not allowed to drive two wheelers / cars while commuting to and from the school. They are also not permitted to bring any expensive / sharp item / mobile phones / electronics gadgets any objectionable item to the school.

- 15. School will observe Bagless days as per CBSE guidelines.
- 16. DEAR [Drop Everything and Read] programme will be observed in the school for students and whole staff to promote reading habit.
- 17. Students' cycles must be locked and parked at cycle stand and students shall not ride in the school compound.
- 18. Playing Holi or bursting crackers within the school premises and in school buses is treated as a serious offence. Stern action will be taken against the student who is found to do so.
- 19. The school reserves the right to dismiss a student whose conduct becomes unsuitable to the school. Immorality, grave insubordination, contempt of authority or wilful damage to property is always a sufficient reason for suspension or expulsion from the school.
- 20. A student whose attendance is less than 75% in an academic year, will not be permitted to appear in the final examination.
- 21. Students using unfair means during test/exams are liable to be expelled from the school.
- 22. Students should return their report cards duly signed by their guardians within two days.
- 23. One month notice or tuition fee in lieu thereof, is to be deposited when a student is to be withdrawn.
- 24. Bag should be arranged according to the Time Table for Classes I to XII. Parents should ensure that their ward carries the books / notebooks according to the time table of the day;

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS' SAFETY

- ✓ The students have the ID card, and the parents have an out card when they fetch their ward.
- ✓ No minor student is left alone. There will always be an attendant, security guard or teacher with him/her.
- ✓ Cameras are installed facing all entry and exit points of the school, corridors, labs, classrooms, library and school buses.
- ✓ In any emergency situation, the parent is called to school immediately.
- ✓ All classes, whether in the art room, playground, cafeteria, classrooms, are diligently monitored.
- ✓ Floor duty and dispersal duty are given to the teachers to monitor the students.
- ✓ We have positive reinforcement protocols that we follow in school, and corporal punishment is not tolerated at LPS.
- ✓ We have counsellors and a special educator to take care of the mental health and behavioural concerns related to students.
- ✓ We have frequent meetings with all the stakeholders regarding issues concerning safety matters of the students and feedback from the staff is also taken on a regular basis.
- ✓ Verified documents and background checks of staff and vendors in transport, security and canteen is carried out.
- ✓ We have the Parent Executive group that conveys all-important decisions to the other parents.

HEALTH CARE IN SCHOOL

- ✓ At LPS we have regular health and medical check-ups for students and staff.
- ✓ A full-time school nurse is available, along with an emergency strategy in place, with the nearby hospital.
- ✓ We conduct talks and workshops on hygiene and different aspects of health.
- ✓ We create social health welfare awareness through student engagement in the morning assemblies

DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

The observance of rules of discipline of the school and good behavior is an essential condition to a student's continuance in the school. ACADEMIC CURRICULUM





Explain : These they communicate what they have learnt so far and figure


out what it means.

learning and understanding has taken place.




ENRICHMENT CLASS

Each pupil is different in terms of learning ability, academic standards, classroom learning and academic performance and each has his own process in learning. The aim of the remedial class is to provide learning support to pupils who lag far behind their counterparts in school-performance. By adapting school curricular and teaching strategies, teachers provide learning activities and practical experiences to students according to their abilities and needs. They also design individualized educational programmes with intensive remedial support to help pupils consolidate their basic knowledge in different subjects, master the learning methods of strengthen their confidence and enhance the effectiveness of learning.
